## Availability of Summary of Benefits and Coverage information

As an employee, the health benefits available to you represent a significant component of your compensation package. They also provide important protection for you and your family in the case of illness or injury.

Your plan offers a series of health coverage options. Choosing a health coverage option is an important decision. To help you make an informed choice, your plan makes available a Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC), which summarizes important information about any health coverage option in a standard format, to help you compare options.

The SBC is available at the AT&T Benefits Center ([att.com/benefitscenter](http://att.com/benefitscenter), or as a former employee, log in through single sign-on at [access.att.com](http://access.att.com)). Select "Plan Documents & Legal Notices" from the toolbar, then click the "Health & Welfare Summaries and Legal Information" tab. A paper copy is also available, free of charge, by calling toll-free **877-722-0020**.

As specified under the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA), the SBC is a four-page (double-sided) summary of material provisions of a health plan in a uniform format, accompanied by a glossary of health coverage and medical terms. The SBC is intended to provide you with a means to compare the health coverage options available, including those in the open market and not offered through AT&T.

The SBC is NOT a substitute for the health plan comparison charts or the summary plan description, which together, provide additional information concerning the cost of coverage, covered services, excluded services, or limitations and requirements for coverage.

## Dependent eligibility

---

Be sure each of your eligible dependents is enrolled. AT&T includes medical coverage for your spouse/legally recognized partner (LRP) and child(ren) up to age 26 (or who are disabled). For additional information on eligible dependents refer to your Summary Plan Description (SPD). You will need to provide your dependents' full legal name and Social Security number when you enroll them. You can contact the AT&T Benefits Center to confirm your dependents' status. Note: You must remove dependents from coverage when they are no longer eligible or risk penalties for benefits fraud. AT&T may audit benefit eligibility at any time. The plan will automatically remove child dependents who are no longer eligible due to age.
